



If you smoked regularly before Nov. 20, 1998 and were diagnosed with a tobacco-related disease, you may qualify for \$14,400-\$100,000 from a landmark settlement.

There are two compensation plans to provide payments to eligible smokers and ex-smokers diagnosed with certain tobacco-related diseases: (a) Quebec Class Action Administration Plan (**QCAP**) with a claim deadline of **August 31, 2026**; and (b) Pan-Canadian Claimants' Compensation Plan (**PCC**) with a claim deadline of **September 3, 2027**. For those who have died that qualify, payments may be available for their estates. These are the covered diseases and maximum payment amounts:



Disease	You started smoking before January 1, 1976	You started smoking on or after January 1, 1976
Primary Lung Cancer or Primary Throat Cancer	\$60,000 PCC \$100,000 QCAP	\$48,000 PCC \$80,000 QCAP
Emphysema or COPD (GOLD Grade III or IV)	\$18,000 PCC \$30,000 QCAP	\$14,400 PCC \$24,000 QCAP

Among other requirements, for **PCC**, the smoker or ex-smoker must have been diagnosed between March 8, 2015 and March 8, 2019 and been alive on March 8, 2019. Among other requirements, for **QCAP**, the smoker or ex-smoker must have been diagnosed before March 12, 2012 and have been alive on November 20, 1998.
